

Youth Sunday 'Outstanding' with Themes of Simplicity, Acceptance, & Healing

Youth Sunday 2020 was held this past August, and the youth did an excellent job! The youth of First Presbyterian Church lead the Sunday worship service in a historically significant youth Sunday that took place online because of the ongoing Covid19 pandemic. All the youth participated in some way and they worked together to bring the congregation a meaningful worship experience led by their director Janece Campbell.

As described by Emma Campbell, "Izzy Campbell brought us together with the Call to Worship, (and) I described "simplicity." Several youth selected words that represented what they thought was necessary in living as Disciples of Christ. They chose scripture that tied their word to the gospel and then each of them talked about what it meant to them. In addition to Emma's discussion of "simplicity", Lily Hilgendorf discussed "acceptance", selecting the special music 'No Matter What' by Ryan Stevenson. Belicia Schoonover chose the word "healing" and discussed God's presence in the midst of our suffering.

Mitchell Worthy and Emaley Gentry did a skit for the confession, placing words on a cross representing our sin, such as "hate" and "exclusive". For the assurance of forgiveness they covered the words of confessed sins with words describing the way Christ calls us to live. Hate was replaced with "love" and "exclusiveness" was replaced with Inclusiveness". Finally, Noah Schoonover prayed the prayer of the day.

All their hard work resulted in a wonderful and very meaningful service, and the congregation appreciates their hard work.



When worship services conclude each Sunday, small groups and Sunday School classes are gathering in person to learn more about God's word and to find guidance for daily living.


Here are the opportunities:




Join Study Via Zoom

The Tooth Bus is ready to roll through Jamaica



The Tooth Bus is a large bus outfitted with all the equipment needed to make and repair dentures. After more than 10 years of visioning, fundraising and

hard work, the Tooth Bus has finally made its way to Jamaica...thanks, in part, to the generous donations of time and money by Chuck and Martha Davis of First Presbyterian Church, Perry.

This project was initially spearheaded by Jim Gaff, a dentist who started traveling to Jamaica through a Mutual Mission program in 1991. During early mission trips, he would have the patient sit in a ladder-back chair, pull the chair into his lap, and begin work on the patient. This went on for a couple of years before some dental chairs and other equipment were purchased so he and other dentists could work a bit more efficiently. Eventually, dental hygienists also became part of the ministry team.

Editor's Note: The congregation of First Presbyterian Church in Perry has faithfully sent a delegation to Jamaica through JEMM (Jamaican Ecumenical Mutual Mission). What our congregation may not know is that we have at least two other members working "behind the scenes" to make sure the ministry of the dental and medical mission teams have "wheels" to traverse Jamaica's terrain. Martha and Chuck Davis have given of their financial resources and their creative talents to make the Tooth Bus a reality for the 2021 Dental Mission trip and for all dental trips in the future. Chuck is credited with repairing and outfitting the bus, as well as rebuilding the engine. RDS Manufacturing donated water tanks and other materials for the project. We salute all our missionaries whether they answer the call by giving up a week to travel, lending their professional expertise or facilitating the missionaries who go with donations and dependable transportation. Jim Gaff's dream for a mobile dental unit began to take shape in 2010 when he found a bus. Thanks to several generous donations by individuals, a \$30,000 grant from the Presbyterian Women, and offerings from meetings of the Presbytery of St. Augustine, this dream became a reality. Untold hours went into repairing and outfitting the bus and rebuilding the engine. A great portion of the work was meticulously done by Chuck Davis, a

member of First Presbyterian Church in Perry. RDS Manufacturing donated water tanks and other materials to complete the rehabilitation

process.

Another of the early generous donations to support the Tooth Bus came from Pauline Lawrence and her husband Carlton Davis, members of Grace Presbyterian Church in Gainesville.

Pauline, born in Jamaica, was particularly touched by the before and after photos of those who received new dentures, and she could see the relief, joy and pride in their eyes and big smiles. She felt called to provide the seed money for this venture. Pauline's grandfather,



Thomas Lawrence was one of the first native born ministers to be ordained in the Disciples of Christ church in Jamaica. Thus, the Tooth Bus has lovingly been named "Ethel," in honor of the mule that "Brother Tom" rode around Jamaica to travel to Sunday worship.

The culmination of this dream happened when local donations and fundraising efforts from Jamaican partners raised money to pay the import taxes and other costs associated with shipping the bus. After a precarious trip to Fort Lauderdale, with several mechanical issues that had to quickly be addressed, the Tooth Bus was loaded onto a shipping container and has now arrived in Jamaica. Jim is planning on another trip soon to stock the Tooth Bus with necessary supplies and make sure it can travel on the backroads of Jamaica. If all goes as planned, the Tooth Bus will be used in early 2021 when Saint Augustine Mutual Mission launches its Dental Mission trip.

The Jamaican Ecumenical Mutual Mission (JEMM) partners are thrilled for this project to be completed and look forward to using the mobile unit throughout their country. JEMM partners include The Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas, The Moravian Church in Jamaica, The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, St. Augustine Mutual Mission (SAMM) and the 57 congregations of our presbytery.

The Presbytery of St. Augustine is grateful for all the hard work and commitment of those individuals who made it possible for the Tooth Bus to become a reality.

There are sure to be big smiles from those who receive new dentures that are made in the up-to-date mobile unit.

The Mission and Outreach Committee would like to invite those interested in serving on the committee to join them for their next meeting.




