

Words from the Pastor

Dear Church Family

In a recent sermon on Paul's letter to the Corinthian church I wrote my own letter to the members of this congregation. I wanted to first and foremost express my gratitude to God and to you for the blessing of being called to serve as your pastor. I have been so pleased to discover such a loving and healthy congregation.

"I Natasha, called to be a minister and a disciple of Christ Jesus by the will of God, To the church of God that is in Perry, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. In the short time I have been here, I have come to know and love a congregation of disciples who work hard, always look up, and seem to always strive to see the good in all, and be the good for all. I see a congregation who seeks to serve God passionately, people who are dedicated to the ministries of this church."

Paul's letter to the church in Corinth was written to address specific divisions and problems. From what I can tell our church family does not share the same issues. However, we know that all church have issues and Paul's words do have something to teach us about being "the church". I, the pastor, along with the session, and you the congregation, have a task ahead of us to prayerfully discern together God's call for the ministry of FPC. We cannot possibly know where God is leading us if we do not first take the time to look back at our past. God has been forming and re-forming our Presbyterian congregation for a very long time. Taking time to look back at God's work in our own church community reminds us of the One Foundation that has supported, inspired, and formed FPC through the years. We are able to remember and honor those whose faithful work carried out the will of God through the specific ministries of the past, and then better understand the miracle of the Body of Christ in change and continuity. What a gift it is that the Holy Spirit who formed the church in Corinth, is the same that formed FPC in Perry from day one. So as we look back in gratitude for the saints who served before us, let us strive to remain open the Spirit of God today.

"In the power of the Spirit, Jesus Christ draws worshiping communities and individual believers into the sovereign activity of the triune God at all times and places. As the Church seeks reform and fresh direction, it looks to Jesus Christ who goes ahead of us and calls us to follow him. United with Christ in the power of the Spirit, the Church seeks "not [to] be conformed to this world, but [to] be transformed by the renewing of [our] minds, so that [we] may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Rom. 12:2). 

Safety and Security



at First Presbyterian Church

February 2020

The Session of FPC has directed Chuck Eckel to lead a team to consider safety and security improvements in the light of today's environment of attacks on churches and the people of the church.

Mission Statement of the Security Team: Improve church security to care for the flock of the church of God, addressing both spiritual and physical risks, informed by Scripture.

"Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood." (Acts 20:28)

Of course, Worship on Sunday morning and Fellowship on Wednesday evening are most important security considerations while continuing to be open and welcoming to those who seek Christ's love through this church body. In addition, improving weekday safety and security for the Rooms To Grow program and the church office staff and volunteers have high priority. Members of FPC have responded to join the Security Team and they have given time to develop important projects for FPC to take in this area. Pastor Natasha has been briefed on the planning and has offered helpful suggestions and made some additional requests. The Session has approved funding for these initial projects.

Over 30 FPC members attended an Active Shooter presentation by Layne E. Schultetus, retired sheriff's deputy and member of the Branford Presbyterian Church. Among several recommendations that Layne and other Presbytery resources provided were to train on First Aid and AED/CPR and to train our usher team in anticipating and handling routine and unusual needs of visitors. As a follow-up, 16 church members have completed the First Aid and AED/CPR training. An additional AED (Automated external defibrillator) has been installed in the Sanctuary narthex plus the one in the Fellowship / Office building.

We have acquired walkie talkie sets for ushers and the nursery worker to communicate. A security camera system has been installed to record activities in the exterior of our campus. Ushers and others will have access to these images and, if an incident occurs, copies of the images can be provided to those investigating. Ushers will lock the more remote doors of our campus when worship starts. Worshipers will be directed the main sanctuary entrance and the Courtyard entrances to the bathroom and the nursery.

Additional projects on building access control will be initiated in the near future and details shared in upcoming newsletters. Chuck Eckel will be happy to receive any questions, comments, or suggestions.

224TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Stated Clerk invites Presbyterians to 180 days of prayer, leading up to the 224th General Assembly (2020). In making this announcement, the Stated Clerk emphasizes that "daily prayer leading up to our denomination's biennial assembly is a reminder that General

emphasizes that "daily prayer leading up to our denomination's biennial assembly is a reminder that Gene Assembly belongs to God, and not to us."

This cycle of prayer "reminds commissioners who are being called by their presbyteries that they will be making significant decisions about the future of our denomination. It also reminds us that members of congregations, as well as our ecumenical and interfaith partners attending the assembly, will be praying with and for us as we meet."

In this call to prayer, all members of the church, from children through senior adults, are invited to consider our church's past, evaluate its present, and plot a prayerful course into God's future. Nelson adds that "this cycle of prayer will invite the Holy Spirit's continued reign over our church, providing strength to make sometimes difficult decisions that are necessary at this particular time — calling the church to do 21st century ministry."

The Stated Clerk believes that the 224th General Assembly (2020) will be one to watch as a denomination. He urges those attending — commissioners and visitors alike — to "look out from themselves and see the need of every church on every corner." He encourages commissioners not to come just to cast votes, but to make a difference in the city of Baltimore.

Nelson invites all Presbyterians, whether commissioners to General Assembly or not, to join in this intentional cycle of prayer. "As we discuss the big issues that face us as a church, may our conversation be undergirded with prayer. I pray that we will do more than just vote, but that we will come with open hearts, open to God's spirit possibly changing our minds about the issues we consider."

Nelson concludes, "I hope that this General Assembly will be a time when we can come together not with a mindset of winning or losing, but with a realization that our decisions should be our discernment of what God wants us to do. I pray that every commissioner leaving the assembly believes that every decision may not have been what 'I' want, but that every decision will be what God wants."

Please be in prayer for the commissioners who will be representing St. Augustine Presbytery at General Assembly. Those attending will be Sandra Hedrick, stated clerk of the Presbytery, Joe Medearis, Emma Cottrell, Cedrick Grant and Bob Bell.


